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**God's gift to help us in each moment to love God and make the right choices**

**The first Sacrament that: washes away our sins, gives us sanctifying grace, & makes us members of God's family, the Church**

**A special voice inside us telling us what is right and wrong so that we can do good and avoid evil.**

**An outward sign, instituted by Christ, to give us grace. Jesus entrusted the sacraments to the Church to help in the mission to save souls.**

**A serious sin that separates us from God and results in the loss of sanctifying grace. It breaks our relationship with God.**

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# Who is present and acting through the priest in the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

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**The sacrament in which we are reconciled to God when our sins are forgiven after Baptism**

**A lesser sin that hurts our relationship with God but does not separate us from God**

- 1. Forgives sins.**
- 2. Restores sanctifying grace.**
- 3. Reconciles us with God and with his Church.**
- 4. Gives us grace to avoid future sins.**

**It means that we are sorry for our sins and that intend not to sin again**

**Jesus**

**Turning back to God after we have sinned**

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# Perfect contrition

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**When we are sorry for our sins because we are afraid of being punished or we recognize the ugliness of sin**

**Another name for the sacrament of reconciliation that points to the need to confess, or tell, our sins.**

- 1. Be sorry and repent of our sins.**
- 2. Confess our sins to a priest**
- 3. Do the penance to repair the damage caused by our sins**

**When we are sorry for our sins because we love God and are sorry for having offended him**
